## Code of conduct for Parents/Visitors

Schools should be places where students, staff, parents, careers, volunteers and visitors to the school should feel safe and happy.

Ensuring Collector Public School remains a pleasant and safe place for all is the responsibility of all who enter the school grounds.

A code of conduct ensures that everyone who visits the school site is able to do so in a safe and harmonious manner and to ensure students, staff, parents, carers, volunteers and visitors are not subjected to inappropriate, unacceptable or aggressive behaviours.

The Collector Public School – School Code is designed to assist in providing the best possible environment for our students to learn, our teachers to teach and the school community to engage in a positive way.

The Inclosed Lands Protection Act (1901) and its Amendments can be enacted if the School Code is deemed to have been breached.

Behaviour that will not be tolerated in our school grounds, and may see the provisions under the Act being followed includes:

- Actual physical assaults or threatened physical assault on students, staff, parents, carers, volunteers, visitors or community members at the school or during the course of school activities;
- Behaviour in the presence of students, staff, parents, carers, volunteers or other visitors to the school that causes alarm or concern to the students, staff, parents, carers, volunteers or other visitor;
- Use of offensive language (i.e. swearing) in the presence of students, staff, parents, carers, volunteers or other visitors;
- Any interruptions to the learning environment of the school such as entering classrooms without permission.
